



## DAWSON LAUNCHES AMBITIOUS YEAR

New President Scott Dawson outlined his plans for the Club for 2005-2006 in his address on taking office. While the Club will continue several important traditional activities, some new approaches and events should be expected.

In particular, tried and true activities, such as the Pancake Breakfast and Two Meal Tickets at Springfest will certainly continue. In addition, Head Start at Christmas, our Fellowship Picnic, and the Prayer Breakfast remain on the list of events.

New activities will likely include the following: a KKids Club at the elementary school level, and a committee for the Coalition for Human Care in Moore County. And the Board of Directors has already approved in concept several new fund raisers:

- Texas Hold 'em Tournament (that's poker, y' all)
- Kiwanis Kasino Night with a live auction for prizes using funny munney.
- Horse Event of some sort (this does catch the imagination, eh?)

In addition, Fun 'n' Fellowship events will likely include:

- Holiday Open House at the Squire's Pub, well known local watering hole and restaurant,
- the Builder's Cup Banquet,
- two Key Club Blitzes,
- one Head Start Read-a-Thon
- a St. Patrick's luncheon, and
- a special patriotic luncheon in July.

Dawson also announced two broad goals:

- more time for our guest speakers' presentations and
- growth of the Sandhills Kiwanis Charitable Foundation.

In the case of the Foundation, some of our scholarship commitments exceed the restricted funds generated by the Foundation, and must be supplemented by unrestricted funds, which come from fund raising activities.

If the Club is able to increase the restricted funds such that annual interest and growth fully support our scholarships, then all Club fund raising activities can go toward children's projects in the community.

Restricted funds include Garner/Picquet and Educational endowments.

Dawson's specific targets include the following:

- Restricted funds from \$50,000 to \$150,000 during the year
- Three year goal to grow the Foundation to \$220,000.

## A GREAT RECIPE...

### TEXAS CAVIAR

Mix together: 2 cans black-eyed peas, drained  
1 can corn kernels, drained

Chop: 2 tomatoes  
4 green onions  
1 red pepper  
2 cloves garlic, minced  
1 green pepper  
1/2 c. parsley

Optional: 1/2 c onion  
1 jalapeño pepper

Combine the above and add 8 oz. bottle of Italian salad dressing. Marinate at least 2 hours before serving. Will hold for five days (REFRIGERATE!!) Drain before serving (and save the juice for future salads) and serve with Tostado scoops or taco chips.
